



BECOME A FOSTER CARE PROVIDER

- Provide traditional foster care for any identified child in need
- Provide kinship care for a child you are related to or with whom you've had a significant relationship



PROVIDE RESPITE CARE

- Provide short term care, typically 1-2 weekends per month, for children whose families need a break. This may be for either biological or foster families.



FOSTER/ADOPT

Sometimes children are not able to return home and need a "forever family". Our concurrent foster homes work on a dual track to help reunify children with their families, but are also willing to adopt children should reunification not be possible.

HOW TO GET LICENSED/ WHERE TO START

- Complete a Foster Care Application
- Complete a Background Study for household members age 13 and up
- Provide references
- Have two years of sobriety
- Participate in a Home Study Assessment
