

Did you know?

Production of recycled paper uses 80% less water, 65% less energy and produces 95% less air pollution than paper production using raw materials.

Recycling 16 aluminum cans saves the energy equivalent of 1 gallon of gasoline.

Glass recycling saves 25 to 32% of the energy used to make new glass and reduces related air pollution by 20% and water pollution by 50%.

Recycling 1 ton of plastic saves 685 gallons of oil, uses less energy and produces 95% less air pollution than plastic production using raw materials.

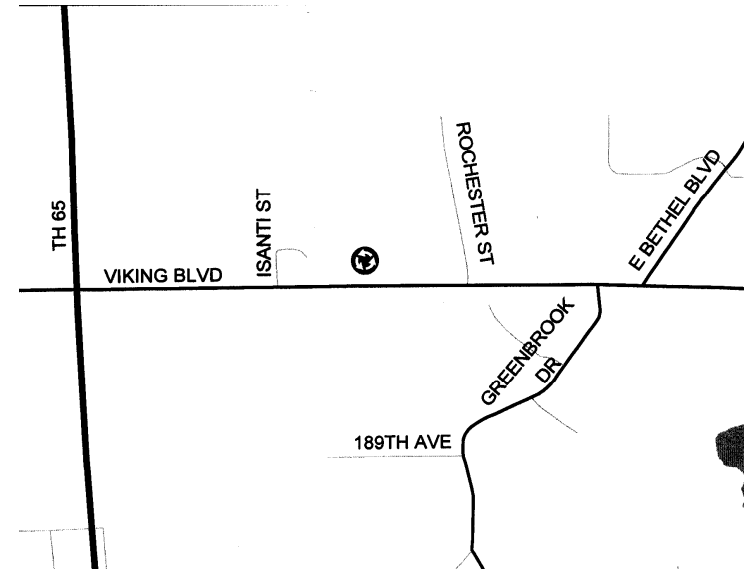

Recycling in East Bethel

Curbside recycling is available to all residents living in single family homes. Waste haulers are required to offer recycling service and may not charge those who recycle more than those who do not recycle.

Trailer courts set up recycling services through their garbage hauler.

A recycling drop-off center for residents is located at 2751 Viking Blvd NE.

East Bethel households average 467 pounds of recycling every year!

Please review the list of materials that can be recycled and recycle more if you can.

Curbside Collection of Recyclables

Set recyclables at the curb by 7 a.m. Place recycling container at least 4 feet away from garbage can. Pickup schedules vary by hauler. Call your hauler for your collection day. Containers are provided by the hauler.

Do not place recyclables in plastic bags.

Aluminum Cans

Aluminum Foil – wipe off food debris; call your hauler, not all haulers accept

Batteries – automotive; call your hauler, not all haulers accept

Glass – food/beverage, bottles & jars; rinse, sort by color (clear, brown, green)

Paper

mail, office & school papers

magazines & catalogs

newspapers & inserts

phone books

shredded paper in closed paper bags

cardboard boxes – flatten

cereal, cracker, pasta & cake mix boxes

shoe boxes, gift boxes & electronics boxes

boxes from toothpaste, medications & other toiletries

paper towel & toilet paper cores



Food Box Guidelines: Boxes from non-refrigerated items (cereal, etc.) are generally recyclable. Packaging for refrigerated and microwavable products, such as frozen entrees, are usually coated in ways that make them unacceptable for recycling.

Plastic – #1 & #2 containers with a neck & a screw-on lid; NO fertilizer, pesticide, chemical or automotive fluid containers; rinse & throw away lid

Steel Food Cans – rinse

Used Oil – must be free of solvents, antifreeze, water, gasoline; place in leak-proof container with a cap; call your hauler, not all haulers accept

Recycling Questions

For specific questions on curbside recycling or a missed collection, call your hauler, hold items until your next recycling day or take them to the recycling center.
