2022 Community Corrections Fees

The proposed 2022 Fees for Anoka County Community Corrections was presented in a PowerPoint and discussed. According a Minnesota statute, the director of community corrections sets the fee structure. The Corrections Department brings the fees to the Corrections Advisory Board for review and affirmation. It is then brought before County Board for approval and is included in the Interim Comprehensive Plan. A brief discussion followed.

A motion was made by Robert DeRoche and seconded by Judge Hall affirming the 2022 Corrections fee schedule.

2022 Interim Comprehensive Plan

Dylan Warkentin presented a PowerPoint on the 2022 Interim Comprehensive Plan for discussion and approval by the Community Corrections Advisory Board. The plan will then go before the Human Services Committee and Anoka County Board of Commissioners for their final approval. The interim plan requested by the Minnesota Department of Corrections addresses any changes in services/programming as outlined in the 2021-2022 Comprehensive Plan. The plan also includes an annual progress report on strategic planning. Highlights include:

- Funding is being continued for the Alternatives to Incarceration program and for the Specialized Mental Health Caseload Pilot Project. Both programs have yielded positive results.
- Crisis Intervention Training and Success Ladder methodology guides staff in de-escalation and a process of engagement, assessment, and targeting the real issues.
- The Juvenile Center program PREA audit was completed in 2021, and plans are in place for 2022 audit of the Workhouse.
- The East Central Regional Juvenile Center is finishing with the new negotiated membership starting in 2022.
- The home visit follow-up study is scheduled to begin after pandemic delays.
- 2022 proposed budgets.

- The strategic plan is reviewed every year and includes updates to benchmarks for training, case management, and service delivery with outcomes measures and cost-effective strategies. A few service delivery projects include continued implementation of Success Ladder and Crisis Intervention Training for staff, improve client contact through web-based supervision portal, and employment diversification. Discussion continued on employment diversification and socio-economic data.

A motion was made by Robert DeRoche and seconded by Judge Hall affirming the 2022 Interim Comprehensive Plan. The motion passed unanimously.
