ACTION REQUESTED	<p>Approve Resolution 2021-PS11, Acknowledging the Retirements and Transfers of Ownership of two of Anoka County Sheriff's Office K-9's:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. K-9 Nieko to Detective Troy Edmond2. K-9 Heinz to Deputy Cole Bangerter.
BACKGROUND	<p>The Sheriff's Office has four K-9's and their partners that are trained in apprehension and narcotics:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. K-9 Neiko and Detective Troy Edmond2. K-9 Heinz and Deputy Cole Bangerter3. K-9 Eli and Deputy Matthew O'Connor4. K-9 Diesel and Deputy Jesse Cutler. <p>K9 Nieko and Troy Edmond completed training and started patrol duties in June 2016. Troy Edmond was promoted to detective on October 9, 2021. Due to the promotion and Nieko's age and health issues, Nieko is no longer a viable resource as a K-9.</p> <p>K-9 Heinz and Cole Bangerter completed training and started patrol duties in February 2017. Cole Bangerter will be promoted to sergeant in November 2021. Due to the promotion and age of Heinz, it is not feasible to transfer Heinz to a new handler.</p>
CONCLUSION	<p>Because of the specialized training Nieko and Heinz have received and their unique relationships with their handlers, they are unsuitable as pets for any owner except their handlers.</p> <p>As such, ownership of the K-9's should be transferred to their handlers.</p>
RECOMMENDATIONS	<p>Approve Resolution 2021-PS11, Acknowledging the Retirements and Transfers of Ownership of two of Anoka County Sheriff's Office K-9's:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. K-9 Nieko to Detective Troy Edmond; and2. K-9 Heinz to Deputy Cole Bangerter. <p>In exchange, the handlers agree to accept all liability related to ownership of their partnered K-9's. Memorandums of Understanding Transferring Ownership of the K-9's to their respective handlers will be signed by Sheriff James Stuart, Detective Edmond and Deputy Bangerter following the approval of the resolution.</p>

**ACKNOWLEDGING THE RETIREMENT AND
TRANSFERS OF OWNERSHIP OF
ANOKA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE
K-9 "NIEKO" TO DETECTIVE TROY EDMOND
AND
K-9 "HEINZ" TO DEPUTY COLE BANGERTER**

WHEREAS, it has been determined that Anoka County Sheriff's Office K-9 "Nieko" and K-9 "Heinz" are no longer viable resources; and,

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office has determined that "Nieko" and "Heinz" have no economic value to the county and wishes to retire "Nieko" and "Heinz" in a humane fashion; and,

WHEREAS, because of the training "Nieko" and "Heinz" have received as sheriff's canines and their unique relationships with their handlers, "Nieko" and "Heinz" are unsuitable as pets for any owners except their handlers:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to Minnesota Statute § 373.01, subd. 1(4), effective October 26, 2021, the County of Anoka hereby transfers ownership of:

1. K-9 "Nieko" to his handler Detective Troy Edmond; and
2. K-9 "Heinz" to his handler Deputy Cole Bangerter.

Detective Edmond and Deputy Bangerter have agreed to accept ownership, responsibility, and liability of "Nieko" and "Heinz," respectively, at no cost to the county.

BACKGROUND	The Township of Linwood has contracted with the Sheriff's Office for the performance of law enforcement services since January 1, 2005. This contract is the annual renewal.
Contract Number Amount of Contract	C0008742 The township agrees to pay the county the sum of \$263,370. Contract services include but are not limited to: a. 8 hours per day of patrol services, and b. 24-hour call and general services. The term of the contract is January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022.
CONCLUSION	The continuation of services provided by the Anoka County Sheriff's Office to the Township of Linwood enhances the safety of county residents and has been in place since 2005.

ACTION REQUESTED	Approval and execution of the 2022 Law Enforcement Contract with the City of Andover
BACKGROUND	The City of Andover has contracted with the Sheriff's Office for the performance of law enforcement services since 1974. This contract is the annual renewal.
Contract Number Amount of Contract	C0008764 The city agrees to pay the county the sum of \$3,337,486. Contract services include but are not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">a. 80 hours per day of patrol services;b. Additional law enforcement services and emergency assistance, as the demand arises and resources allow;c. 6 hours per day of service by a Community Service Officer; and for park security, and an additional 20 hours per week from April through September;d. 80 hours per week of Patrol and Crime Investigator coverage;e. 2 full-time Deputy Sheriffs to be assigned as School Liaison Officers, one assigned to the middle school and one to the high school. During non-school months, the deputies to be assigned to work in such areas as patrol, selected enforcement, and crime prevention;f. 50% of the costs associated with the Crime Watch Program's coordinator position. The term of the contract is January 1, 2022, through December 31, 2022.
CONCLUSION	The continuation of contracted services provided by the Anoka County Sheriff's Office to the City of Andover enhances the safety of county residents and has been in place since 1974.
RECOMMENDATIONS	Approval and execution of the 2022 Law Enforcement Contract with the City of Andover.
