Organics for Composting

New! Organics Recycling Drop-off Program at Anoka County Compost Sites

Organics are a resource, not a waste!

Recycle food scraps, paper products, coffee grounds and more at Anoka County yard waste sites for FREE. When you participate in the organics recycling program, your food scraps and non-recyclable paper products will be recycled into compost - a valuable resource that improves soil, reduces erosion and decreases the need for fertilizers.



This program is separate from the regular yard waste program for leaves, grass clippings and brush. Please do not mix yard waste with your food waste.

What are organics?

Organics include all food scraps, most non-recyclable and food-soiled paper and certified compostable products. Organics recycling is one more way you can recycle; it is important to recycle organics to help Anoka County achieve our goal of recycling 75% of our waste by 2030.

30 % of the waste generated in Anoka County is compostable.

How does the program work?

It's easy, get started today

- Please sign up at AnokaCounty.us/recycle or by calling our office 763-324-3400.
- Pick up a free starter kit at the compost sites.
- Collect organic waste in a compostable bag and tie off the bag.
- Come to the compost site during operating hours and place the bag in the container designated for organics recycling.
- Ask the monitor for more free BPI certified bags.

- BPI certified paper plates, cups and utensils
