### • Recycling Totes


Anoka County has **FREE** recycling totes for residents to use to collect and transport recyclables to a common recycling area.

# Small Steps to Success



## These tips will help you succeed:

- Place recycling bins next to all trash bins.
- Let tenants know recycling is expected and provide resources for what is recyclable. Helpful handouts, refrigerator magnets, or bags/totes are available.
- If language barriers exist, visit [RethinkRecycling.com](http://RethinkRecycling.com) to download Somali and Spanish recycling guides.
- Have clear, clean and readable labels on all collection containers, with images.
- Provide easy access to recycling bins, in common areas, laundry and mail rooms.
- To reduce illegal dumping, consider adding cameras to dumpster areas.
- Keep outdoor recycling areas clean, accessible and free of snow.

## Reuse & Recycling Reminders

Spare yourself (and your tenants) some hassles by considering all three Rs – Reduce, Reuse, Recycle:

- 1.** Talk to Arc Value Village, Goodwill or the Salvation Army about hosting a collection event at your building.
- 2.** Consider placing a donation bin in your laundry room or somewhere on the building premises.
- 3.** Please contact Anoka County Environmental Services to properly dispose of hazardous waste left by residents or generated from your building or grounds 763-324-4260.
