Preschoolers learn by:

- ❖ Copying
- ❖ Following examples
- ❖ Following simple directions
- ❖ Playing make believe
- ❖ Moving

Your child can do these activities and play these games:

- ❖ Catching/Throwing
- ❖ Galloping/Hopping/Skipping
- ❖ Leap Frog
- ❖ Hopscotch
- ❖ Climbing
- ❖ Hide-and-peek
- ❖ Dance to music

Things and toys to play with:

- ❖ Beach ball/large balls
- ❖ Plastic coffee can lids (Frisbee)
- ❖ Jump ropes
- ❖ Empty boxes or baskets
- ❖ Dress up clothes
- ❖ Hula hoop

Preschooler love to help with chores. Have them help:

- ❖ Dust
- ❖ Water plants
- ❖ Pick up toys
- ❖ Set the table for meals
- ❖ Sweep

Ways to make Minnesota winters fun:

- ❖ Go sledding (use a cardboard box if you don't have a sled)
- ❖ Go ice skating (sliding on boots works too)
- ❖ Build a snowman for each person in the family (even the pets)
- ❖ Make snow angels
- ❖ Build a snow fort
