

NEW! Battery Recycling

Batteries and most electronic waste are considered hazardous. They can contain toxic or corrosive materials. When crushed, batteries can explode and cause fires.

Do

- Dispose of batteries at the HHW facility or other designated collection locations
- When possible, remove batteries from devices
- Store damaged batteries in a clear plastic bag

Do Not

- Dispose of used batteries in trash or recycling bins
- Crush or puncture batteries
- Store old batteries close to flammable material, metal or other batteries

What to Bring to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility at No Charge



The Anoka County Household Hazardous Waste Facility accepts waste from residents at no charge that are labeled:

- Caution
- Warning
- Danger
- Poison
- Combustible
- Corrosive
- Flammable
- Inflammable
- Toxic



The facility also accepts at no charge medical sharps, fluorescent bulbs and propane tanks.

Home Improvement Products

- Paint, varnish and stain
- Paint stripper, paint thinner, turpentine
- Petroleum-based adhesives
- Roofing tar
- Mercury thermostats
- Wood preservatives
- Driveway sealer



No frozen or dried out products.

Automotive Products

- Carburetor cleaner
- Degreasers
- Fuel (gasoline, kerosene)
- Motor oil, oil filters and antifreeze
- Petroleum-based waxes and finishes



Household Products

- Aerosols
- Batteries
- Drain and oven cleaner
- Mercury thermometers
- Mercury thermostats
- Nail polish and remover
- Propane tanks



Used Sharps

- Hypodermic needles
- Syringes
- Lancets
- Pen needles
- IV needles
- Used Epi-Pens®



Place sharps in rigid, puncture resistant container. Label container: "Do Not Recycle: Household Sharps." Seal to prevent spills.

Fluorescent Bulbs

- Compact fluorescent lamps (CFLs)
- Fluorescent bulbs
- High intensity discharge (HID)



Fluorescent bulbs contain mercury. Intact or broken, it is illegal to put them in the garbage.

Do not tape fluorescent tubes together.

Lawn & Garden Products

- Ant, bug, roach and rodent killer
- Bug spray
- Fertilizer with weed control
- Weed killer



Transportation & Arrival Guidelines

- Do not mix products together.
- Seal tightly and place containers upright to prevent leaks or spills.
- At the facility all waste must be in your trunk, cargo bed or trailer for staff to remove.
- Remain in your vehicle while staff assist you.
- Have your drivers license or identification card ready upon arrival to the site.
- Any items left in your vehicles by staff are not accepted.

What NOT to Bring to the Facility

- Appliances
- Asbestos
- Dried Paint
- Electronics
- Empty Containers
- Explosives
- Garbage
- Unknown Materials
- Radioactive Waste
- Tires
