

COURT ORDERED CHEMICAL DEPENDENCY EVALUATION

Your Chemical Dependency Evaluation must be completed within the due date given by the judge. Make an appointment immediately to meet this deadline.

1. **PAYMENT FOR THE EVALUATION OR RECOMMENDATION IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.**

Utilizing your own resources may save you money if treatment is recommended. Contact your insurance company by calling the customer service number on the back of your card to inquire about chemical dependency evaluation coverage, referrals to facilities, possible co-payments, and other information. Let them know you want a chemical dependency evaluation done on your child.

If the insurance company wants to know the reason you are inquiring about an evaluation, explain the problems you are experiencing and that you suspect it may be related to chemical use. Common problems can include truancy, police contact, poor school performance, changes in attitude, mood swings, and loss of interest in activities.

2. If your insurance will not or does not cover chemical dependency evaluations, the information listed below may be helpful.

RULE 25 ASSISTANCE: This is available state funding if you meet the criteria. To determine if you qualify for this funding, call 763-324-1270 for a financial screening. If you do qualify for this funding, you will be provided contact information to set up an appointment for the evaluation.

SLIDING FEE: If you do not have insurance and do not meet the financial criteria for RULE 25 assistance, you will need to call a treatment facility that conducts assessments. Information can be found online at: www.accap.org and on the reverse side of this sheet.

3. **RELEASE OF INFORMATION:** At the evaluation appointment, a release of information must be signed by the parents and child for Anoka County Corrections/PO's name. This gives the evaluator permission to send a copy of the evaluation and recommendations to the Probation Office.

4. If the recommendation of the evaluation is treatment, education, or aftercare, you must begin within 15 days.

A COPY OF YOUR EVALUATION NEEDS TO BE RECEIVED BY YOUR ASSIGNED PROBATION OFFICER BY THE COURT ORDERED DUE DATE. IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE YOUR PROBATION OFFICER RECEIVES A COPY OF YOUR EVALUATION.
