



Enhanced Treatment Program (ETP)

Program Overview

The Enhanced Treatment Program (ETP) is designed to assist women who are:

- Involved in Child Protection or Criminal Justice System
- Parenting
- Struggling with chemical dependency issues
- Court ordered to the program

The Enhanced Treatment Program is an intensive one-year program focusing on a mother’s chemical abuse which affects her ability to parent.

The program will provide support services and resources to increase each participant’s ability to benefit from treatment and successfully transition back into the community.

Program Components

The ETP program will support clients through all phases of their sobriety:

- Pre-treatment
- Treatment (as recommended by Rule 25 or CD assessment)
- Aftercare
- Maintenance of sobriety while transitioning back to the community
- Ongoing alumnae support

Referrals come from Anoka County Social Services, Corrections, or the Court.

Each client works individually with an ETP case manager to define individual needs. These needs are addressed through individual treatment plans.

Clients are also involved in weekly group counseling which includes Cognitive Behavioral Therapy, Mental Health support and Chemical Dependency support throughout the duration of the program.
