The bottom line: For the 2018-19 school year, the amount a student can earn before it is counted as income is \$6,570.

To make more than that, a student would have to work more than 17 hours a week for 52 weeks a year, assuming they made the federal minimum wage of \$7.25.

"For most dependent undergraduate students, what they're going to earn for their summer job is a few thousand dollars so it won't be an issue," said Kathy Ruby, director of college finance at College Coach.
