



## **PassPoint Ocular Chemical Use Screening Information**

Anoka County Community Corrections utilizes ocular screening as a less-invasive chemical use screening option for some clients. Ocular screening kiosks are located at our Rum River Fahr Building 10 and Administration Building 13. Clients directed to submit to ocular screening must review the important information below.

### **Provide Initial Baseline at the Fahr Building 10 Location:**

To use PassPoint ocular screening, clients must provide a set of baseline eye scans once their sobriety has been verified by urinalysis (UA). Standard urine screening must be continued until a clean baseline urine is provided. A new baseline eye scan may be required upon changes in medications or medication dosage, eye injuries, or at the direction of Anoka County Community Corrections staff.

### **PIN Number and Fingerprint Scan:**

Clients are assigned an identifying number to use as a PIN to access the ocular kiosk. Clients must enter the PIN and provide a verified fingerprint scan each time they test so the PassPoint kiosk recognizes who is testing.

### **Tips for using Ocular Screening:**

Ocular screening is a tool to detect possible drug and alcohol use. Follow up urine testing may be required at any time; however, the following tips may minimize the likelihood of the kiosk recommending urinalysis for any reason other than chemical use:

- Avoid wearing heavy or dark eye make-up;
- Do not blink excessively when testing;
- Keep your agent updated on any changes in medications as that may result in the need for a new baseline;
- No talking/chewing gum when testing;
- No hats or glasses may be worn during testing (contacts are ok);
- Wash hands prior to coming to screen/placing finger on scanner;
- Sit in the provided chair while scanning;
- Do not drink energy drinks prior to testing;
- Take your medications as prescribed and on a consistent schedule.

Clients may be directed to continue testing strictly by urinalysis (UA) in situations that prevent use of an ocular screen, such as vertigo, blindness, injury to their eyes, or other reasons identified by their supervision agent.

Ocular screening clients are still subject to random urinalysis at any time at the discretion of Anoka County Community Corrections. Contact your agent with any questions.
